LIP-Learning: Refugee Study Project Application Requirements for Scholarship Students

Living in Peace (LIP) is a Certified Nonprofit Organization established in Japan in 2007. With a vision of "Equal Opportunity for Everyone," we are running the Refugee Project to support refugees and immigrants in poverty to live independently in Japan without being excluded or discriminated.

In 2020, we started a refugee study project named "LIP-Learning" to provide various learning opportunities for refugees living in Japan without Japanese citizenship. We are calling for scholarship students to learn Japanese online this year as well.

Since companies in Japan require certain levels of the Japanese language for foreign employees, we aim to support as many refugees as possible to improve their Japanese skills and facilitate their self-reliance through employment in the country.

Application Requirements 2020

LIP-Learning, run by the Refugee Project of LIP, a Certified Nonprofit Organization, supports refugees living in Japan with various learning opportunities. In 2020, we help refugees continue learning Japanese.

1: Eligibility	 Eligible applicants are those who meet the following requirements: (1) (i) Refugees under Convention Relating to Status of Refugees, or (ii) Anyone who can prove to have a background as refugee from refugee support groups. (2) Willing to stay in Japan for at least one year after the start of the course, learn Japanese and wish to find employment in Japan (3) Willing to take two lectures a week (4) Able to cooperate with monitoring (checking learning progress) conducted by us during the scholarship program (5) Able to actively cooperate with our exchange and PR activities after the completion of the program 	
2: Details of offer, duration, etc.	For the duration of one year (may be extended), we offer online Japanese school programs. The programs are conducted in group lessons. Private lessons are available upon request. (*We will provide the program and will not grant cash. Students also need to have their own Internet environment set up.)
